

Steven Rivkin

Professor of Economics and Department Head

University of Illinois at Chicago

Steven Rivkin is professor and head of the Department of Economics at the University of Illinois at Chicago, director of the John F. Kain Center for Education Research at the University of Texas at Dallas research associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research and fellow at CES-IFO Research Institute in Germany. He is the author of widely cited studies in the economics and sociology of education including educator effectiveness and labor markets, charter schools, school desegregation, accountability, class size reduction, peer influences, and instruction time.

His work focuses on the United States, but he has also written on education in Chile and Central Europe. Rivkin has served on government advisory committees and task forces and was a member of the Amherst and Amherst Regional School Boards. He received his B.A. from the University of Michigan and his Ph.D. from the UCLA Department of Economics. He worked for the Organization of the Northeast (ONE) on a utility-funded program to reduce heating and housing costs for low-income renters and homeowners in Chicago and was a post-doctoral fellow in the National Science Foundation urban poverty program at Northwestern University.

Prior to taking his current position at the University of Illinois at Chicago, Rivkin was a professor in the Economics Department at Amherst College from 1993 to 2011, where he held the Rachel and Michael Deutsch Chair.
